Big Idea:

Prior to the arrival of the Europeans in the late 15th century, the Americas teemed with cultural diversity. Dozens, if not hundreds, of different peoples occupied various environmental and cultural spaces. While some groups, such as the Maya of the Yucatan peninsula, grew to enormous proportions, other groups, mainly in North America, remained somewhat small and isolated. Two groups in particular - the Inca and Aztec - represent the greatest achievements by American societies prior to the arrival of Columbus.
