
## Transformation of the West, 1450-1750



#### I. European Renaissance

- <u>A. Renaissance</u> means "rebirth", refers to a revival in art and learning
  - –Italian Renaissance: 1300-1450
  - –Northern Renaissance: 1450-1600
- Connects to ancient Greece and Rome
  - Renaissance artists/scholars looked to their works and ideas for inspiration

#### **B.** Religion declined as central focus

- <u>Humanism</u> an intellectual movement that focused on human potential and achievements
- <u>Secularism</u>– worldly, rather than spiritual, and concerned with the here and now



# C. Wealthy merchants and monarchs became patrons of the arts

• *Motivated new generation of thinkers and artists* 

#### D. Information/ideas spread quickly

- 1300s: moveable type reached Europe from China
- 1440s: Johann Gutenberg invents the printing press, can print whole books quickly and cheaply
  - Bible was first book to be printed using these new techniques (1455)

#### <u>A. Reformation</u> –

- Why?
  - Wealthy disliked paying taxes to church in Rome
  - Many Church leaders seen as corrupt/uneducated






- B. Martin Luther (1483-1546)
- Angry over the practice of selling <u>indulgences</u>:
  - Pardon that released sinner from performing the penalty a priest imposed for sins
  - Many thought that buying indulgences guaranteed them a spot in heaven






- C. Wrote the <u>95 Theses</u> (formal statements) attacking Church
- People should be able to interpret Bible for themselves
- Challenged authority of the Pope
- Rise of <u>Protestantism</u>
  - Christians who belonged to non-Catholic churches
  - Examples: Lutheranism, Calvinism, <u>Anglican church</u>







<u>D. Catholic Reformation</u> – response to Protestantism

 Sponsored education reform, sent missionaries into Asia, Americas

 Disallowed indulgences, removed corrupt officials

#### III. Impact of the Reformation

A. Conflict among Christians became common

 <u>Thirty Years War (1618-1648)</u> – Protestants vs. Catholics in Germany; devastated population, economy


 <u>English Civil War (1642-1649)</u> – concerned religious disagreements and Parliamentary rights; King Charles I beheaded (first monarch to be killed while holding the throne)





- Religious conflicts affected every aspect of life
  - More questioning of religion's role in life
  - Political balance shifted (rise of France, Britain, Netherlands)
  - Decline of papal authority

- <u>Witchcraft persecution</u> women, poor, social outcasts often accused
  - Uneducated masses had no way of dealing with drastic changes in society had to blame someone for your problems!



#### IV. Economic & Social Revolutions

• Continued <u>Commercial Revolution (increase in the</u> access to goods and the ability to buy them)

- Leads to inequalities and social unrest
  - Entry into Global Economy brings even greater access to new wealth
  - But, also brings inflation (money doesn't buy as much as it used to), commercialization

- Prices rise, but continued production/trade brings opportunities
- Ordinary peasants could enjoy aspects of life not previously available
  - Wine, spices, sugar, kitchenware, furniture
- Growth of the <u>proletariat</u> people without access to wealth-producing property
  - Many will become manufacturing workers, urbanized poor



- <u>Scientific Revolution</u> 17<sup>th</sup> century European intellectual movement
  - Resulted in rise of scientific research/experimentation and rational thinking
- New technologies and tools extend scientific possibilities
  - -Microscope, telescope, observations of natural world



- Fathers of Scientific Revolution
  - -Copernicus
  - -Galileo
  - -Isaac Newton
  - -Francis Bacon





- Beginning of cultural transformation of West

   Science, not religion, slowly becomes central to
   intellectual life
  - –<u>Deism</u> role of God = set natural laws in motion, not regulate
  - –<u>John Locke</u> everything you through senses and reason, not faith

# V. Further Political & Economic Changes

- 17<sup>th</sup> century signaled the end of the feudal system
  - Rise of the <u>absolute monarch</u> king/queen with complete power over military and population
    - No longer relied on nobles for control
    - Examples: France, Spain, Prussia
  - <u>Parliamentary monarcharies</u> signal the future of Western Europe
    - Populations grew more bold in demanding rights, clashed with Kings
    - Examples: England, Netherlands

# V. Further Political & Economic Changes

 Rise of the <u>nation-state</u> – political unit consisting of an autonomous/independent state inhabited mostly by people sharing a common culture, history, and language
